What is New Hope for Kids?

New Hope for Kids is the largest independent grief center in the State of Florida. We are also one of the oldest wish-granting organizations in Central Florida. We concentrate on children, ages 3-18, and families coping with life-threatening illnesses and/or the loss of loved ones due to death.

How many children does *New Hope for Kids* help?

We assisted 375 children in 2012 through grief facilitation and granted 51 wishes to children with life-threatening illnesses. Since inception, *New Hope for Kids* has helped over 5,500 children -- over 4,000 through grief facilitation and over 1,500 children who had their wishes granted.

What programs does *New Hope for Kids* provide?

New Hope for Kids helps children and families cope with significant grief and loss related to a death through our **Grief Program** at the **Center for Grieving Children**. We have parent support groups, community awareness projects, information and referral services, as well as family events and summer camps for children and families.

Our **Wish Program** grants wishes to children who are not yet 19, and are diagnosed with a life-threatening illness. The two programs work together to provide a total family support program.

A Story of Grief, Hope and Healing

The Bernard family consists of father, James, and his children, Ava, Chloe, Mia, and Asher. They are an energetic, talented family that attends *New Hope for Kids* Center for Grieving Children. James' wife and mother of their four children died in 2011 after a long battle with leukemia. After his wife's death, James had concerns about some of the ways his children were experiencing grief: acting out, feeling depressed and expressing rage. Since they began attending the Center for Grieving Children, James has seen many positive changes in his kids, who are now ages 4-10. They love the grief support groups and James knows that the sessions have had a huge impact on their lives. Ava has even expressed interest in becoming a grief facilitator in the future to help others dealing with grief. *New Hope for Kids* has also benefitted James as a parent. As he does not attend counseling, participating in sessions at the Center for Grieving Children is his only chance to talk to other parents and caregivers who are facing very similar challenges. James' advice to new families contemplating whether or not they should contact *New Hope for Kids*: "Just do it. It is an inviting, non-judgmental environment that ends up feeling like home." The Bernard family has made connections with other local families who are dealing with grief. James feels that this is an added benefit to the services *New Hope for Kids* already offers. He thinks the group and community atmosphere at *New Hope for Kids* is particularly effective for him and his children because they enjoy being around people. Overall, James and his family cherish their time at *New Hope for Kids* and they cannot imagine where they would be without it.



DPR Commitment to 'Build Great Things' extends to NHFK

Since December 2010, the DPR Foundation has supported *New Hope for Kids* with grants totaling \$95,000. Our celebration for 2013 was held at the Center for Grieving Children with a check presentation award of \$40,000!

"DPR's commitment to 'Build Great Things' extends far beyond our offices or customers -- we strive to go into the communities where we work and live," said Peter Nosler, co-founder of DPR Construction and president of the DPR Foundation board. "Through the Foundation, we focus on building long-lasting relationships with local organizations that help kids gain an enriched community experience. Once we select an organization, our commitment is solid and we expect to continue our financial and volunteer support year after year."



"Passionate is how we feel about *New Hope for Kids*" states Maritza Mojica, who serves as the liaison between DPR's Orlando Office and NHFK. "We stay connected and energetic to further strengthen our relationship. The more we learn, the better we serve." She has coordinated DPR team members for this year's Magic Game/Teen Outing, summer camp, and has begun planning for upcoming family events in the fall.

The Foundation measures the success and progress of these programs on an annual basis to ensure each grantee stays on mission and is achieving results. Among other activities, DPR Orlando volunteers participate in annual family events, back-to-school, holiday gift card and holiday toy drives benefitting *New Hope for Kids*.

Maitland Fire Department Visits New Hope for Kids

A letter from our Executive Director...

New Hope for Kids is pleased to announce that we are closer than ever to achieving our goal of a larger facility! Our dream... of a home-like environment for our program services... of space to serve all age groups at once... of getting rid of waiting lists for program services... all of these dreams and more are about to be realized. We are thrilled with what this means for the children and families of Central Florida.

Since our founding in 1996, we have grown steadily and evolved to meet the needs of children and families in our community. Each year there has been greater demand for grief support services as the population of Central Florida grows and as more families learn of the services we offer. Children continue to face the death of loved ones through terminal illness, accidents, homicide and suicide. More heartbreaking cases of children with life-threatening illnesses like cancer, cystic fibrosis, and degenerative brain disease are presented to our wish program. Sadly, these are factors that are not going to diminish, but continue to increase.

We are excited to say that we are in the final stages of purchasing a 14,000 square foot facility in Maitland. Once renovated, this new building will allow us to undertake all grief and wish services offered by our organization in an efficient and effective way, as well as to offer additional programs and activities for the children and families we serve. Although we've been limited in our 4,000 square foot facility for some time, we see incredible opportunities for so much more in our new "home"!

Generous support from our community has helped build our programs and work with greater numbers of children every year. Soon we will launch our Capital Campaign, *Building New Hope*. This is a once-in-a-lifetime campaign designed to help us raise the money to buy and adapt this new building. We encourage you to help us achieve this goal by providing your support for this endeavor. There will be opportunities to give on every level, from a personalized brick in our "Path to Hope", to sponsoring a support or activity room, all the way up to naming rights of the building itself! The first \$300,000 in donations will even be matched by a local foundation. Consider asking your employer if they would provide matching funds for your donation. Or maybe you know of a foundation or potential donor we could contact. Every dollar helps!

Children sometimes don't have the words to articulate their feelings, but sensory activities such as drawing or other art activities are a natural language through which to express themselves with the imaginative world of symbols and picture making. We ended the day with a walk-around art show (fun!)...and yummy cupcakes!
