# What is New Hope for Kids?

New Hope for Kids is the largest independent grief center in the State of Florida. We are also one of the oldest wish-granting organizations in Central Florida. We concentrate on children, ages 3-18, and families coping with lifethreatening illnesses and/or the loss of loved ones due to death.

# How many children does *New Hope for Kids* help?

We assisted 327 children in 2010 through grief facilitation and granted 50 wishes to children with life-threatening illnesses. Since inception, *New Hope for Kids* has helped over 4,600 children -- over 3,300 through grief facilitation and over 1,350 children who had their wishes granted.

# What programs does *New Hope for Kids* provide?

New Hope for Kids helps children and families cope with significant grief and loss related to a death through our **Grief Program** at the **Center for Grieving Children**. We have parent support groups, community awareness projects, information and referral services, as well as family events and summer camps for children and families.

Our **Wish Program** grants wishes to children who are not yet 19, and are diagnosed with a life-threatening illness. The two programs work together to provide a total family support program.

#### **Grief and Rebirth**

Carolyn Moor's husband, Chad, was in a tragic car accident and died on Valentine's Day, 2000. When he died, their daughters were faced with the loss of their father and, in a way, with the loss of their mom, at least for awhile. Crushed and overwhelmed, Carolyn locked herself in for 3 months, unable to deal with the details of life. Friends brought in food, checked on her, tried to comfort and console her. Nothing seemed to help. The first ray of light came when a minister suggested she take her girls to a place called *New Hope for Kids*.

Each time they attended *New Hope for Kids' Center for Grieving Children*, her daughters, then ages 3 and 6, would run off with the other kids and get busy with special activities designed for their age groups. Carolyn would sit down in the adult support room and listen to the other parents express their fears, sadness and hope. For 3 months she didn't say a word. Then one day her heart felt a little stronger and she began to share her story.



Out of Carolyn's grief, strength was born. In 2003 she joined the *New Hope for Kids* Board of Directors. She loves being a part of this great organization and seeing it make a profound difference in the lives of others who are grieving. Her strength also gave birth to Moor Alive Interiors. Thanks to the insight gained on her grief journey, Carolyn realized the importance of the home environment in the healing process. Creating transformations in her clients' spaces brings her joy as she watches their lives become transformed in the process. In 2008 Carolyn founded CLOVE Orlando, a group of women who live to build a better community one woman at a time. CLOVE stands for women who are Conscious, Luminous, Open-hearted, Vital and

Empowered. Through CLOVE Orlando, Carolyn is partnering with author Jill Butler to bring an event to Orlando based on Butler's book "Create the Space You Deserve". People from around the country will be coming together on April 15, 2011 to enjoy a day of personal growth while sharing their talents and stories with others. *New Hope for Kids* will be one of 5 non-profits benefiting from proceeds of this event.

Carolyn's healing began at *New Hope for Kids* and continues to this day. She admits the journey of grief is a long one, but she is living proof that, with the right help and lots of hard work, joy and purpose can return to life again.

#### New Hope for Kids 2010 Holiday Season

The holidays are always a busy time at *New Hope for Kids*. We kicked off the 2010 holiday season with our food drive in November. Once again we received enough food donations to provide the ingredients for thanksgiving meals to over 200 families. The season continued to bring opportunities for the families in our grief and wish programs to spend time together. Several family events, including our North Pole Party with Santa's Shop, our family day at Old Town in Kissimmee and special candlelighting ceremonies and a pot-luck luncheon for our grief families made this holiday season a full and memorable one.

The toy drive keeps us incredibly busy each December. Whether we're gathering donations from around Central Florida, organizing them, gathering requests or coordinating "family traffic" at the *Center for Grieving Children*, we are challenged to make sure all goes well right up to the last minute. We are pleased to report that our 2010 Holiday Toy Drive was a great success. Countless individuals and businesses contributed enough toys and financial donations that we were able to distribute 2,815 gifts to 569 children in our programs. Thank you, Central Florida. Your compassion for the children of *New Hope for Kids* is inspiring and overwhelming!



#### From our Executive Director

One of the unique features of *New Hope for Kids* is the inclusion of the family unit in our wish and grief programs. While children are our focus, we recognize the need for the entire family to participate in the healing activities we offer. In 2010 alone our grief and wish programs served 772 adults and children! As you can imagine, our needs for support and space are growing larger all the time.

With this growth the need for a larger facility is felt more strongly than ever. Our *Center for Grieving Children* in Maitland is at the straining point. Our 3 age groups – Littles, Middles and Teens – are currently being held with only 2 age groups at a time due to limitations of the structure. Due to scheduling issues, some families with children in multiple age groups must attend twice a week.

If you have followed our attempts at expansion over the past 6 years, you know that we had hopes of building a new, larger structure in Maitland. When that journey ended in 2010 we renewed our search for a place we could call "home". With our list of criteria in hand, several options were explored. An existing building in Altamonte Springs has been located and we are currently pursuing it with hope of working through the negotiations. If successful, we'll make necessary renovations and move our program and administrative offices some time this year.

When that happens, please consider supporting us financially as we meet the ever-growing needs of Central Florida children. This is a huge endeavor, but we are committed to making sure every child and family who needs our help has the opportunity to be served by New Hope for Kids.

#### Meet Anthony C. Martin




