Our Story

Since 1996, New Hope for Kids has been helping Central Florida children in need.

Our purpose is to bring hope, healing and happiness to children and families suffering from grief, loss or life-threatening illnesses.

New Hope for Kids achieves this through two programs:

The Center for Grieving Children

which helps children and families cope with the feelings of grief and loss after the death of a loved one.

Wishes for Kids

which grants wishes to children up to the age 19, diagnosed with a life-threatening illness.

We are able to continue our pursuits from funding that comes primarily through charitable donations by individuals, corporations, foundations and community service organizations in Central Florida. No funding is received from government agencies. New Hope for Kids is a registered 501(c)(3) organization.

New Hope for Kids is governed by a volunteer board of directors from the Central Florida community. David C. Joswick, serves as the Executive Director. He is known in the Central Florida community as an advocate for children, focusing on the difficulties associated with grief and loss.

A Message... from our Executive Director

The year 2020 brought unforeseen challenges to the entire world. In order to meet those challenges and continue serving grieving children and families during a pandemic, New Hope for Kids quickly shifted our grief support services to a virtual platform. Groups were modified to operate on Zoom, and it worked. Kids processed their grief through special activities with friends in virtual group sessions. Adult group participants stayed connected to each other virtually, sharing feelings of fear, anxiety and grief. Covid-19 changed life as we knew it, but it didn't stop us from helping kids and families moving forward on their grief journeys.

Our Wishes for Kids program was met with its own COVID challenges. The very nature of the wish program includes a vulnerability that was magnified by the pandemic. Children who come to us for a wish are already in an at-risk health situation, even in normal times. and parents were extra protective of their wish child's health, as we expected and respected. Popular wishes became out of reach due to theme parks closing, travel restrictions and more. A bright spot for a few wish children came in the form of a specialized bike that was a perfect fit (literally, they're custom made!) for a pandemic. They allowed these great kids to enjoy a sense of freedom and fun times outdoors with their family.

The newly added Alan J. Saffran Scholarship Fund granted four college-bound students \$2,000 each in 2020. These exceptional young people had attended our grief program after the death of a parent, and shown perseverance in the face of adversity.

The launch of the scholarship program was a great success, and we look forward to offering this benefit to the young folks in our grief program for years to come.

While shifting to manage the effects of the pandemic on our programs, we continued to focus on our Garden of Hope. In October 2020 we were granted our Certificate of Completion from the City of Maitland. This important milestone marked the beginning of opportunities to bring the healing effects of nature into our program services.

The US Small Business Administration's PPP loans (Payroll Protection Program), created to provide financial assistance during Covid-19, allowed us to avoid any reduction in staff during the pandemic. These funds helped fill in gaps in donations, resulting in a close to normal income year.

New Hope for Kids is committed to meeting the challenges of changing times with compassion for those who need us. With your help, we will continue to bring hope into the lives of the children and families we serve.

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What is the Grief Support Program?

New Hope for Kids' Grief Support Program provides a safe and supportive environment where children grieving the death of a loved one can share their experience with others facing the same feelings of loss. New Hope for Kids believes every child deserves the opportunity to grieve in a supportive and understanding environment. New Hope for Kids strives to provide our families with hope, healing and renewal.

We extend support for the entire family through parent support groups, community awareness projects, information and referral services, family events, and summer camps.

How it Works

Children are grouped by age to work through their grief using activities of play, painting, drawing, journaling, and most importantly discussion. Children who attend the Grief Program report feeling understood, supported and a decreased fear. They gain immense relief from talking to peers who are going through similar feelings and emotions, a particularly helpful experience they may not achieve at school or even at home.

Since 2008, communities throughout the country have observed Children's Grief Awareness Day. Shedding light on the needs of grieving children, and seeing the benefits they obtain through the support of others.

It's difficult enough for an adult to deal with the grief and pain associated with illness and death. For a child, it can be that much more complicated. The practice of Grief Awareness Day is imperative to ensuring that we are providing children with the skills and acknowledgment to handle their grief and pain in healthy ways.

The challenges of the pandemic have made this year's observance unique, and while a small group of active grief program families participate in a special New Hope for Kids' candle-lighting ceremony and memorial walk, others participated at home through a virtual presentation.

Journey to Hope!

2020 marked the second year that New Hope for Kids expanded its grief support offerings to include young adults ages 19-25. Journey to Hope was created in collaboration with Rollins College Communications and with seed funding from the New York Life Foundation. These support groups meetings focused on aspects of the grief experience and how it can impact this important time in a young adult's life. Stress management, self-care, and learning the importance of a safe and strong support network were themes of some of the gatherings.

Despite the many difficulties of 2020, we were able to run many of our events through adaptations and perseverance. Each summer, New Hope for Kids creates a special camp for kids in our grief and wish programs. Technology has provided a way for us to "camp" virtually, which we did in 2020! Creative, fun, friendshipbuilding activities were "Zoomed" to campers at home in this special virtual experience. Staff and volunteers led campers in crafting, dancing, making music, telling stories, making (and eating!) snacks, and much more.

This year, we were able to hold 5 fun-filled family events! Utilizing both virtual and drive through formats, for the safety of our kids! Cumulatively, in attendance were 458 kids, and 282 adults!

Fundraising Events Include: Art of the Vine Event netted \$65,387 BMW Drawing of Chance netted \$135,079 Other miscellaneous events raised another \$1,216! **C** Fundraising is critical to sustain our mission. In the world of Covid, Art of the Vine 2020, our largest fundraiser, had to get creative and went virtual for the first time. Huge success thanks to our great group of supporters.
